ITEMS TO BRING:

1. PJs, personal hygiene items. Bed & bath linens are provided by the facility for our use. We no longer need to bring our own bedding-- unless you are really attached to that sleeping bag and special pillow.
2. Goodies to share for munching (M&Ms, chips, cookies, pop, etc.—good food also qualifies).
3. Beading projects! Bring enough supplies and beads for several projects, with beads to swap, as well as pieces for show-and-share. Bring whatever you like (**Remember to bring light & extension cord.**)

WHAT NOT TO BRING: No alcoholic beverages or pets. Smoking is not allowed inside building.

FACILITY: Symond's Hall accommodates up to 26 guests. Includes conference room, dormitory that will sleep 14, kitchen, dining room, 4 bedrooms (with three beds each), & a bathroom on each floor w/showers.

DIRECTIONS: From Anchorage: Glenn Hwy to Parks Hwy. Once in Wasilla, go past Fred Meyer and Wasilla Lake. Turn right on Main Street / Wasilla Fishhook Road (there is a Tesoro station on the right corner). Drive 6.8 miles and turn right at the "Meier Lake" signs (Two signs marks the entrance—one metal and one wood—both set back in a little, so be alert).

WHY YOU SHOULD COME: These weekends are A LOT OF FUN (think slumber party, laughing, beading until the wee hours, and more laughing). Enjoy the opportunity to get to know other beaders you usually see only at meetings, in classes, or in the bead stores. Experience their generosity first-hand, as they offer you the one bead you need to finish your project and forgot to bring, or offer a tip that makes beading oh-so-much easier.
